The Vine Institute is in partnership with DAI (Develpoment Associates Institute) Leadership Ministries Canada and Western Seminary in Portland, Oregon to moderate the Ministry & Organizational Leadership Program which includes four courses. We are thrilled because most of the 20 Christian leaders registered are graduates of *The Vine* Institute who desire to continue learning how to better serve their churches.

Even though earning a certificate from Western Seminary is popular, the assignments to write two papers (five to eight pages long) is daunting. Our students are very successful leaders in their churches and communities, but for most of the students English is their second to fifth language and most have not written or typed in English. Yet their desire for leadership education is very important to them and we don't believe these skills should prevent them from learning to be better leaders.

When we realized that the number of students who would need assistance would be great, we sent out a call for Educational by Liz Micka

Mentors who will assist students in reaching their goals. We were delighted that 13 mentors volunteered to help the students. Karl Mueller from DAI says the support

Our first course is on Conflict Management and Transformation. All of us deal with these issues in our churches

and communities. Oziel de la Cruz said this course

is transforming the way he sees conflict. The course is giving the students a way to manage conflict and work towards reconciliation. The goal is reconciliation, which is the gospel.
